TOGAF for Practitioners 2009

Public Courses

Course objective and pre-requisites

This instructor-led course provides detailed training in TOGAF 8 certification and will provide training for the new features of TOGAF 9 Level 1 and 2. Students should already have an understanding of IT or Enterprise architectures.

Case study develops understanding

The course takes students through the TOGAF material using a case study. Throughout the course the instructor assesses each student's understanding of TOGAF and their ability to apply TOGAF to the case study. Also each student will receive an electronic workbook containing 26 questions. Students will have time allocated to them during the course to answer the questions corresponding to the course materials. The instructor's assessment and successful assessments of the workbook by a workbook mentor leads to students being nominated for TOGAF 8 certification by The Open Group.

Course duration

TOGAF for Practitioners 2009 is a four-day course.

Course content

The course covers all of the features that are common to TOGAF 8 and 9

- The business rationale for Enterprise Architecture and TOGAF
- The TOGAF Architecture Development Method and its deliverables, including Business, Data, Applications and Technology Architecture
- The Enterprise Continuum
- Enterprise Architecture Governance
- Architecture Principles and their development
- Architecture Views and Viewpoints
- Requirements Engineering using Business Scenarios
- Architecture Maturity Assessments
- Architecture Skills Framework
- An Introduction to Building Blocks

The course also covers the many new features added in TOGAF 9

- Architecture Partitioning
- Content Framework and Meta Model
- Capability Based Planning
- Gap Analysis derived from Gap Analysis with new materials
- Business Transformation Readiness
- Using TOGAF to develop Security Architectures
- Architecture Repository
- Using TOGAF to develop SOAs

This course meets ALL of the requirements for TOGAF 8 certification and addresses ALL of the Learning Outcomes required for TOGAF 9 Level 1 and Level 2.

Successful completion of this course is dependent on:

- (1) Active participation in the course
- (2) Successful completion of an in-course work book to demonstrate understanding

Successful completion will:

- (1) Qualify candidates for TOGAF 8 Certification
- (2) Prepare candidates for the TOGAF 8 to 9 bridging examination

In addition to teaching sessions, the course makes extensive use of exercises based around a case study to develop understanding.

To take full value from the course, students should already have an understanding of IT or Enterprise architectures.
